I. PURPOSE

TheCollegevalues the freedoms of speech thought, expression and assembly as part of its core educational and intellectual mission while also maintaining the integrity of the academic environment and the security of students, employees, visitors, and college property; including those partnership spaces located on college property. Students and non-students who engage n expressive activities in permitted outdoo areas maydo so

Demonstration assemblies, and dissemination of information are valid expressions, whether in support or dissenting opiniop sovided they do not materially and substantially disrupt the academic and administrative functions of the Collegeor infringe upon the rights of other individuals or organization to engage in expressive crivities. It is not the role of the Collegeto shield individuals from protected expressive activities, including, without limitation, ideas and opinions the may find unwelcome disagree able or even deeply offensive.

This procedure in oway prohibits individuals from engaging n conversations athe College but rather ensures that:

- Students and nostudents have the freedom tongage outdoor expressive ctivities within the limits of reasonable content neutral restrictions on time, place, and manner of expression that are consistent in accordance with the Florida Campus Free Expression Act provided they do not materially disrupt previously scheduled or reserved activities on campus;
- 2. Students and nostudents are permitted to assemble and engage in spontaneous protected outdooexpressive activity as long assuchactivity is not unlawful and one not materially and ubstantially disrupt significant college interests;
- 3. The Collegecampusand facilities are available to speakersponsored by student groups or departments/programs pursuant to college procedures;
- 4. Commercialspeechs not protected y law as an expressive ctivity.

The College affirms its commitment to freedomspeech, assembly, and expression even when the language or ideas of these king avenue for free expression may ontradict the College's ideals and policies or the personal views lating employees and student the content of expressive activities will nate considered in egulating speech inoutdoor areas, except to the extent permitted law. The College prohibits free speech zones, but may place reasonable imitations on time, place, and manner of speech The College does not take a position on the content of the expression, but rather allows for variety of viewpoints to be expressed.

Individuals, organizations or groups, both internal and external to the College, may not conduct commercial transactions or engage in commercial speech on college property unlessdirectly authorized througspecificcontracts oarrangements witbollegeofficials.

VII. DISSEMINATION OF INFORMATION/PETITIONING

The College encourages the dissemination of **com**mercial information and petitioning on college propertion a waythat is consistent with the educational mission of the ollege, its orderly operation, cleanliness, aesthetics, and the safety of its students, employees, and visitors.
